****BACS 291, Business Statistics** may count as three (3) hours of Business Electives. **STAT 251, Statistics for Business & Economics** may count as three (3) hours of non-business electives

The nine (9) semester hours of business electives may include any course with a BA—prefix **except:** BA 100; BA 101; BA 251; BAFN 240 and BAMK 260. Business majors may not count any of the preceding courses towards the 120 minimum credits required for graduation.

*****Computing Proficiency Exam:** The College maintains a computing proficiency requirement as a prerequisite to certain business courses. It is expected that most students will demonstrate this proficiency as they enter the program by passing a proficiency exam. To sign up for the exam, go to the following address: <http://student1.mcb.unco.edu/exam>. Students may also meet the proficiency requirement by substituting a satisfactory grade in BA 101 Business Computing or its equivalent from another institution. Students should note however, that the credits from BA 101 or its equivalent will not count toward the minimum of 120 credits needed for graduation.

Students should take BACS 305, Intermediate Business Statistics as soon as they have completed all prerequisites for the course.

Students must complete a minimum of 30 semester hours in the content area in Categories 4 through 7. The following courses meet both UNC General Education and Business Requirements: **ENG 123**, Category 1b; **MATH 124**, Category 2; **ECON 103** and **ECON 105**, Category 5b; **PSY 120**, **PSY 265**, Category 5e; and **SOC 100**, Category 5f. Students who take BA 205 instead of ENG 123 may count BA 205 as a business elective and it shall meet the requirement for Category 1b in General Education.

Students must attain a 2.0 or greater cumulative Business GPA and attain at least a "C" grade in each course in the Business Administration Core. In addition, a grade of "C" or better must be earned for any of the courses listed in the *Required Emphasis* and *Required Elective Credits*.

Students must meet the course prerequisites as stated in the CURRENT UNC Bulletin. Please check the current bulletin each term you register to make certain you meet those prerequisites.
